1.	Get to know the profession
	I have visited the Students section of the American-Speech-Language and Hearing Association (ASHA) website <a href="http://www.asha.org/students/">http://www.asha.org/students/</a> to learn more about the major and the profession.  I have reviewed the document *Essential Functions for Professionals in Communicative Disorders*. I have considered whether my abilities and skills are a good fit with the demands of this profession.  I understand that a Master's degree is required to become a licensed Speech-Language Pathologist and a Doctoral degree is required to become an Audiologist. I am aware that entry into the Bachelor's program in CD does not guarantee admission into the graduate program.

	Statistics (MATH 124 or ISED 160 at SFSU or equivalent):
	<ul> <li>Social science:         Effective Fall 2016, course in one of the following area will be required PRIOR to starting CD major courses: psychology, sociology, anthropology, or public health.     </li> </ul>
